NYSE Euronext, which brings together six cash equities exchanges in seven countries and eight derivatives exchanges, is a world leader for listings, trading in cash equities, equity and interest rate derivatives, bonds and the distribution of market data.**

Cooper B-Line are supplying their market leading Access Rack to the NYSE on both sides of the Atlantic. Having won the contract for Datacentres in the US and UK, B-line are supplying 52U high Access racks with enhanced cable management functions. The racks are supplied in 'Special Pod Units' and all feature the 'High-flow' curved perforated door. As well as delivering the racks to the sites Cooper B-Line provided an installation and commissioning service.

As part of the installation the 'i-ACS' system is also being deployed (Cold Aisle Containment System). By using this system the Cold Aisle in a Hot Aisle Cold Aisle configuration can be contained. This form of containment eliminates hot and cold air mixing within the datacentre helping to deliver cold air to the racks, thus improving cooling efficiency.

The positioning of the racks in both datacenters allows the retro-fit of the i-ACS system at a later stage if required.

Cooper B-line are also providing the i-ACE system within the NYSE datacenters. This closed loop access cabinet configuration provides N+1 cooling duty of up to 20kw per cabinet.
